The Healthy Families national model requires families initiate services with the first child, prenatally or before the child's third month of age. Great Parents Great Start serves families with children birth to 3 years. A Home Visitor offers weekly home visits to help families identify needs and resources, learn to understand & track child development, develop a healthy nurturing bond between parent and child, be aware of child safety and health needs, and prepare children to be developmentally and social/emotionally able to succeed in school and life. 	<u>Triple P Positive Parenting Program</u> Evidence-based national model designed to help parents improve their parenting skills & build positive relationships with their children. Serves families with no CPS involvement whose child age 2 to 5 has a behavior problem. 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Livingston Educational Service Agency (LESA) – Early On	<p><u>Early On:</u> Children 0-3 who qualify with a 20% developmental delay in speech, gross motor or cognitive ability. Children may also have feeding issues, sensory issues, and be delayed in self help skills. A referral is made by doctors, parents, relatives, etc. and an evaluation is scheduled for staff to visit the home. An evaluation is completed and eligibility is determined at that time. If a child qualifies, then a family service coordinator is identified and goals and strategies are discussed and implemented. LESA staff continue to monitor and strategize if new needs are identified.
